Welcome to St Matthew's Parish Church

In John's Gospel Jesus often speaks of his 'hour'. The hour is the culmination of his mission, and it is also the condemnation of 'this world' and its ruler. Now the 'hour' (of his passion and death) has finally come. On the one hand he feared it – we see the very real disquiet with which he approaches it. But he also longs for it, for he is sure that in this hour of crisis and suffering the Father will glorify him.

In John's Gospel Jesus does not pray to be delivered from the hour of trial and death (as he does in the other Gospels), for the hour is the whole purpose of his life.

He uses the example of a grain of wheat dying in order to yield a harvest, thereby suggesting that his death will bear much fruit: when he is lifted up on the cross he will draw *all people* to himself. ('All' means Jews and Gentiles which of course includes Greeks who have come asking to see him).

It is our custom to spend some time in quiet preparation before the liturgy begins, and save further conversation until we meet socially for refreshments afterwards. The following prayer, based on today's themes, may be found helpful:

Prayer / Reflection

There is a lot of dying mixed in with living.

Every time we pass from one stage of life to another, something is us dies and something new is born.

We taste death in moments of loneliness, rejection, sorrow, disappointment, and failure.

We are dying before our time when we live in bitterness, in hatred, and in isolation.

Each day we are creating our own death by the way we live. Lord, help us to live in such a way that our lives will be fruitful. And in your mercy grant that when we die to this life we may be born to eternal life.


