Welcome to St Matthew's Parish Church

Jesus called the disciples to follow him. They left their homes and their work and went around the country with Jesus. It was a wonderful time of miracles and crowds following him. Life was a great adventure.

Jesus did not promise that following him would be easy. He said there would be times when we would have to deny even our own desires. If we are following the crucified one, we too have to take up our cross. Jesus knew that some things are lost by being kept to ourselves. We lose the ability to play the piano or to do well at sport if we do not practise. Practise means denying ourselves the time to go out whenever we feel like it. To follow Jesus means personal discipline. There can be no discipling without discipline.

It is our custom to spend some time in quiet preparation before the liturgy begins, and save further conversation until we meet socially for refreshments afterwards. The following prayer, based on today's themes, may be found helpful:

Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.



In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:


