¶ 131st Dedication Festival

According to ancient custom church buildings are dedicated to the service of God by act of solemn consecration in the course of a special ceremony at which a bishop presides. Henry VIII, in 1536, ordered that the Feast of Dedication should be kept 'throughout this realm' of England on the first Sunday in October, an injunction still followed to this day if the date of consecration is not known.

The Parish Church of St Matthew, Northampton was dedicated on St Matthew's Day, Thursday 21st September 1893, by the Bishop of Peterborough, Mandell Creighton. He also instituted The Revd John Rowden Hussey as first Vicar.

This anniversary of the dedicated church building reminds us that it is *Domus Ecclesiae*, the 'House of the Church', the house of God's pilgrim people. God's Church is the community of the baptised, rather than the building in which they gather. We are the People of God called to serve him by living and proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ in the world, to be 'living stones', and so nurture and grow his kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.
