Welcome to St Matthew's Parish Church

Safeguarding St Matthew's is committed to providing a safe environment for all who come. If you have any concerns, please speak with one of our welcomers or a churchwarden who may be identified by their lanyard. They will be happy to help you.

Live streaming Please note that this service is being streamed. You may sit where you wish. If, however, you prefer not to be seen online, please sit in a side aisle. The administration of Holy Communion will not be shown.

GDPR Some of St Matthew's services (most Sunday mornings and some special services) are live-streamed or recorded for those who cannot attend church in person. Under GDPR, the church must gain the consent of anyone whose image may be captured, as this constitutes collection of "personal data". This includes clergy, readers/intercessors, musicians and congregation. Whilst every at-tempt is made not to capture the faces of members of the congregation, this may occasionally happen if people turn around or move around the church during the service. The exception is communion, when the congregation is not filmed. The side aisles and back of the nave are so far as possible film-free areas not covered by the camera. Any-one whose personal data is collected must give their consent. Consent forms are avail-able both in church and on the website. The full policy can be read on our parish website or on the noticeboards in church.

Toilet and baby changing facilities may be found at the base of the church tower. There is also a small servery.

For younger children In the north aisle (nearest to Collingwood Road), a carpeted area equipped with age-appropriate Christian resources is provided. Please feel free to make use of it.







In this morning's Gospel we see how far the apostles are from the spirit of self-sacrifice. James and John want the top places in Jesus' kingdom. Obviously, they thought that his kingdom would be modelled on worldly kingdoms, where those in high places enjoy honour, power, and glory.

But Jesus tells them that his disciples are not to imitate the Gentiles, whose rulers lord it over people. In his kingdom service is what makes one great. Authority in his Church must wear the unmistakable livery of service.

He set the example himself. He came 'not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many' (a reference to his saving death).

In Jesus we have a high priest who can sympathise with us in all our trials and sufferings. We can approach him with confidence because he knows our weaknesses and was like us in all things except sin.

It is our custom to spend some time in quiet preparation before the liturgy begins, and save further conversation until we meet socially for refreshments afterwards. You may find the following reflection/prayer, based on today's themes, helpful:

Reflection

The fruit of prayer is faith.
The fruit of faith is love.
The fruit of love is service.
And the fruit of service is peace.

Lord, cleanse our hearts of greed and envy. Give us a spirit of willing service for our brothers and sisters, so that we may belong to your kingdom on earth, and come to share your glory in heaven, where you live and reign for ever and ever.

\P The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

Reader A reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one

does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

'You are my Son,
today I have begotten you';
as he says also in another place,
'You are a priest for ever,
according to the order of Melchizedek.'

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.
