Safeguarding St Matthew's is committed to providing a safe environment for all who come. If you have any concerns, please speak with one of our welcomers or a churchwarden who may be identified by their lanyard. They will be happy to help you.

Live streaming Please note that this service is being streamed. You may sit where you wish. If, however, you prefer not to be seen online, please sit in a side aisle. The administration of Holy Communion will not be shown.

GDPR Some of St Matthew's services (most Sunday mornings and some special services) are live-streamed or recorded for those who cannot attend church in person. Under GDPR, the church must gain the consent of anyone whose image may be captured, as this constitutes collection of "personal data". This includes clergy, readers/intercessors, musicians and congregation. Whilst every attempt is made not to capture the faces of members of the congregation, this may occasionally happen if people turn around or move around the church during the service. The exception is communion, when the congregation is not filmed. The side aisles and back of the nave are so far as possible film-free areas not covered by the camera. Any-one whose personal data is collected must give their consent. Consent forms are available both in church and on the website. The full policy can be read on our parish website or on the noticeboards in church.

Toilet and baby changing facilities may be found at the base of the church tower. There is also a small servery.

For younger children In the north aisle (nearest to Collingwood Road), a carpeted area equipped with age-specific Christian resources is provided. Please feel free to make use of these facilities.

The Feast of Christ the King

Good morning, and a very warm welcome to our celebration of the Feast of Christ the King, the final Sunday of the Church's year. Today we gather to honour Jesus Christ as Lord of all — the one who reigns not through power or force, but through love, mercy, and the gift of himself upon the Cross.

This feast invites us to look beyond earthly kingdoms and authorities, and to place our trust in Christ, whose kingdom is founded on justice, peace, and truth. As we prepare to enter the season of Advent next week, today we give thanks for Christ's eternal reign — a kingship that reconciles all things to God.

In our readings today, Saint Paul reminds the Colossians that in Christ all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and that through him all things are held together. And in our Gospel, we see the paradox of Christ's kingship most clearly: as he hangs upon the cross, mocked as "King of the Jews," he reveals the true nature of divine authority — forgiveness, compassion, and the promise of paradise to the penitent thief.

So let us open our hearts to worship the King of kings, to renew our allegiance to him, and to rejoice in his unending kingdom of love and peace.

It is our custom to spend some time in quiet preparation before the liturgy begins, and save further conversation until we meet socially for refreshments afterwards. The following reflection, based on today's themes, may be found helpful:

Reflection

On the cross Jesus endured insults and mockery. Yet his heart remained open, even to his enemies. He absorbed all the violence, transformed it, and returned it as love and forgiveness. One's pain can so easily turn to rage, so that one wants only to lash out blindly at whoever happens to be within range. From the depths of his own pain, Jesus reached out to comfort the thief. Some people are like sugar cane: even when crushed in the mill, what they yield is sweetness. Jesus stretches our capacity for compassion. He challenges our idea of love. Each of us has a great capacity for love. The pity is that it often goes unused. By our love people will know that we are followers of Christ the King.
